Students fill shoe boxes with gifts to brighten Bosnian kids' holiday

The students at Grassland Middle School in Franklin saw the faces of Bosnia's homeless, hungry and cold children on television.

They wanted to help.

So the students filled 55 shoe boxes with gifts, including toys, small items of clothing and other personal items like cothbrushes and combs, which will be shipped overseas this week as part of peration Christmas Child.

"The students know about what is ging on in Bosnia, they know that cildren there are being maimed and kiled and that they are living under very stessful circumstances," says Nicole Reette, a Grassland Middle School texter and student council sponsor.

Operation Christmas Child is spasored by the national relief oranization. Samaritan's Purse, which aiifts the shoe boxes to children affected byar, famine, disease and other crises aund the world.

he goal this year for Operation Clatmas Child is 500,000 shoe boxes.

here is something special about the bes we sent," Revette says. "Our boxes anoot boxes donated by Durango Boot Gere, and they hold a lot more than ordinary shoe boxes."

The Grassland students also enclosed a letter in each box to the child who will receive it.

Helping to deliver the shoe boxes overseas will be Barbara James, whose son Stephen is an eighth-grade student at Grassland.

James is manager of telemarketing at Thomas Nelson Publishers in Nashville, which is publishing the children's book Miracle in a Shoe Box.

The book, written by Franklin
Graham, son of evangelist Billy Graham,
and Estelle Condra, a Nashville
storyteller and children's author, follows
one of the shoe boxes on its journey from
a brother and sister in the United States
to a brother and sister in Bosnia.

Thomas Nelson Publishers, which also is publishing Graham's autobiography Rebel With a Cause, is involved in the real life counterpart to Miracle in a Shoe Box.

In addition to encouraging bookstores across the country to participate in Operation Christmas Child, Nelson collected nearly 500 shoe boxes from the employees of the corporation's various divisions.
